

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

This annual report card is issued by the Oregon Department of Education. It provides a detailed picture of what Redmond High School offers to our students. This year Redmond High School received an Overall State Rating of average. This means that our students are performing as well as students at other Oregon high schools.

School highlights:

Our students averaged 86.6% meeting or exceeding the state standard for reading over the past two years, exceeding the state standard of 82%.

Our students averaged 71.4% meeting or exceeding the state standard for math over the past two years, exceeding the state goal of

67%.

Our five year graduation rate increased 6% from last school year to 72.2%, meeting the state requirement of 72%.

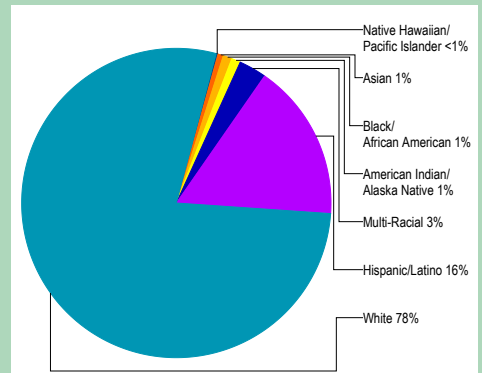

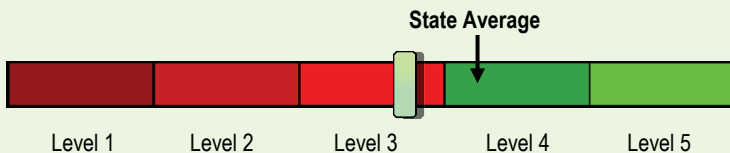


OVERALL STATE RATING

HOW ARE STUDENTS AT THIS SCHOOL PERFORMING COMPARED TO THOSE AT OTHER SCHOOLS?

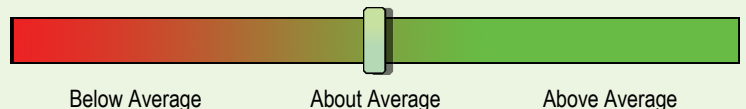
The overall state rating is intended to summarize this school's particular successes and challenges. It is based on a combination of up to five factors. Three of these factors come from standardized test scores in reading and math: student achievement, student growth, and the growth of underserved subgroups. High schools are also rated on the overall graduation rate for the school and the graduation rates of underserved subgroups. Please be aware that this rating is based mainly on high-stakes testing and accordingly, represents a limited view of student performance. Other aspects of this report card are designed to put this rating in the proper context.

Compared to all schools statewide in 2012-13, this school is rated as Level 3.



- Level 1** = Falls into the bottom 5% of schools
- Level 2** = Falls between 5% and 15% of schools
- Level 3** = Falls between 15% and 44% of schools
- Level 4** = Falls between 44% and 90% of schools
- Level 5** = Falls into the top 10% of schools

Compared to high schools with similar student demographics in 2012-13, this school's rating is about average.

- About average** = Falls into the middle third of comparison schools
